



CAT - Post Operative Discharge Checklist

1. Do not feed your pet until the day after surgery.
2. Your pet can have a small drink of water the same evening of the surgery, but if your pet vomits after drinking, withhold water until the next day. Call our office if vomiting persists.
3. If your pet was declawed, use shredded litter or Yesterday's News pelleted news paper in your pets litter box for the next 7-10 days, Place a small amount in a clean pan, replace the litter each time your pet soils.
4. Do not allow the incisions to get wet- no bathing or swimming for 10 days.
5. **Do not allow your pet to lick or scratch at incision.** We are dispensing an e-collar for your pet today. Please use it for the next 7 to 10 days (or until suture/staple removal if applicable) to prevent your pet from damaging the incision site.
6. Check the incision area daily for 10 days. Call our office if the incision looks red, puffy, gaping or if there is any drainage.
7. Should your pet's declawed paws have break through bleeding, apply lite pressure with a clean cloth. Keep active pets from jumping up on and off of high places. Confine your pet in a safe room or crate if you are unable to control jumping.
8. Call our office if your pet is showing any sign of illness.
9. Call our office if your pet is showing any signs of discomfort or pain.
