

## <u>Post Operative Discharge - Declaw</u>

- Use shredded newspaper litter or Yesterday's News pelleted newspaper in your cats litter box for the next 10 days, Place a small amount in a clean pan, replace the litter each time your pet soils. It may be necessary to set up multiple boxes if you are away during the day.
- 2. Do not allow the incisions to get wet- no bathing or swimming for 10 days.
- 3. Should your cat's declawed paws have any bleeding, apply light pressure with a clean cloth. Keep active pets from jumping on and off of high places. Confine your pet in a safe room or crate if you are unable to control jumping.
- 4. Your cat may have on/off limping over the next few days. This is usually due to being overactive. Allow your cat to rest, use a crate if needed, and the limping should resolve. If your cat continues to exhibit lameness please call.
- 5. Monitor paws for swelling or discharge for the next 10 days. If any problems please call our office immediately.
- 6. Call our office if your pet is showing any sign of illness.
- 7. Call our office if your pet is showing any signs of discomfort or pain.
